The premise of this study is that: emotional health and spiritual maturity are inseparable. It is not possible to be spiritually mature while remaining emotionally immature. Participants will gain both a biblical and secular understanding of EQ, as well as develop the primary skills needed to identify and assess EQ for themselves, learning how to use this information as they interact with others. Special focus will be the four general areas EQ: Self Awareness; Self-Management, Social Awareness,

He spent three years as a Resident Director at Evangel University in Springfield, Missouri; two years as the Dean of Students at Asia Theological Center in Singapore; and twenty-five years as a professor & administrator at the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary (AGTS) in Springfield, Missouri. Jay enhanced the AGTS community through the development of a student life and spiritual formation department, creating an integrated culture of holistic personal and spiritual growth.

Concurrent with serving at AGTS, for nearly two decades Jay has served the Vice President of Development at Asia Theological Center (ATC), a fully accredited Bible college in Singapore. ATC has students from nearly 50 countries around the world. (This is a position which Jay still currently holds, and he travels back and forth to Singapore.)

Currently, Jay has partnered with the Assemblies of God World Missions and moved to Kenya to assist in developing ministry training opportunities for East African church leaders. Jay loves working with leaders in these multicultural settings. It's a perfect fit, as he is passionate about equipping students for global impact. Jay's relational leadership style naturally encourages students in their quest of fulfill their God-given visions for life and ministry.

Dr. Anthony Loke is an independent researcher, lecturer, author, and preacher. He is currently an adjunct lecturer with BCM, AOIC, SPTC & JBCM. Formerly an ordained ministered with TRAC Conference of the Methodist Church in Malaysia, he served as a full-time lecturer & academic dean in Seminari Theoloji Malaysia. He graduated in 2011 with a PhD in Old Testament from the University of Wales, UK. He is the author of 13 books and continues to write his series 'The Old Testament Made Simple' published in collaboration with Pustaka SUFES. He has led pilgrimage groups to Israel/Jordan for 13 times. His wife is the principal of a church-based learning centre reaching out to refugee children in KL.
